Who we are:

- **Josephine County:**

- 12th largest county in Oregon by population 86,395 in 2018
- 2 incorporated cities consisting of 45% of the total population
- Largest City: Grants Pass with 37,285 people

- **Jackson County:**

- 6 largest county in Oregon by population 219,200 in 2018
- 11 incorporated cities consisting of 68% of the total population
- Largest City is Medford with 80,378 people

Who we are:

- 3 CCOs, 2 hospital systems
- >80% identify as White, non-Hispanic
- Hispanic or Latino are the fastest growing segment of pop, second largest racial/ethnic group in the region
- Older pop with >20% ages 65 or older
- >40% live below 200% of the poverty level

Top health issues shared by counties:

- Drug and Alcohol Use
- Safe and Affordable Housing
- Mental Health
- Poverty and Jobs
- Parenting Support and Life Skills
- Education and Job Training

2019 CHIP

Three Priorities:

1. Behavioral Health (including mental health and substance use)
2. Housing
3. Parenting Support & Life Skills

Priority 1: Behavioral Health

- Lessen the effects of trauma
- Decrease social isolation and loneliness in youth and older adults
- Equip our community with the knowledge, tools, and resources to empathetically accept and help individuals in need of behavioral health supports
- Prevent use and misuse of substances
- Promote ways to reduce the harm that happens with mental health and substance use issues through the use of community-wide approaches
- Improve access and coordination of care for people impacted by mental health and substance use disorders

Priority 2: Parenting Support & Life Skills

- Help families feel connected, cared for and strengthened
- Help families have access to safe, affordable and quality childcare
- Increase access to food, including healthy food
- Have community-based organizations work together to help deliver coordinated services.

Priority 3: Housing

- Increase the number of people paying 30% or less of what they earn for housing.
- Increase the number of people living in homes that are safe, accessible and easily served by community services.
