Objectives

Highlight CCO community health improvement plan programs and efforts to:

1. Improve collaboration across CCOs, local public health, hospitals, local mental health, tribes and other key community partners or stakeholders
2. Address the new State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP) priority areas

2020-2024 SHIP Priorities

- Institutional bias
- Adversity, trauma and toxic stress
- Economic drivers of health (including issues related to housing, living wage, food security and transportation)
- Access to equitable, preventive health care
- Behavioral health (including mental health and substance use)

CCO 2.0 Policy Opportunities

- Changes¹ to CCO CHA/CHIP requirements include:
 - CCOs must partner with local public health, nonprofit hospitals, and any CCO with a shared service area to develop shared CHAs and CHIPs.
 - CCOs must invite tribes to partner in shared CHA/CHIP when tribes have or will develop their own CHAs and CHIPs.
 - CCO CHIPs must address at least two SHIP priorities, based on local need.
 - CCO CHIP development must include tribes and organizations that address the social determinants of health and health equity, including THWs.

Themes and SHIP Alignment

Based on initial* review of 16 CHIPs across 14 CCOs

- 79% are focusing on Behavioral Health (11)
- 50% are focusing on Housing (7)
- 57% are focusing on Social Determinants of Health and Equity (8)
- 36% are focusing on Access to Care (5)
- 36% are focusing on Oral Health (5)
- All had alignment with two or more SHIP health priorities

*Final validated numbers are not yet available and these numbers could change
