

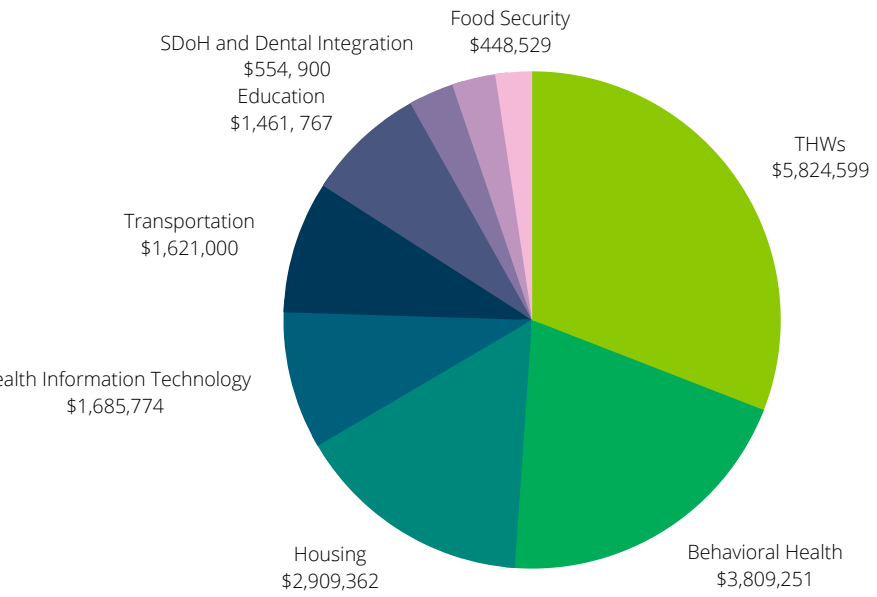


## Leading with Purpose

Each year, members of the DST engage in a thorough strategic planning process that involves reviewing a collaboratively established committee charter. This process, facilitated by a community chair and supported by an internal, IHN-CCO co-chair, ensures that the committee's objectives, structure, key deliverables and activities, and member responsibilities are aligned with IHN-CCO's Quadruple Aim (better health, improved access, reduced cost of care and improved provider satisfaction), the Community Advisory Council (CAC), and the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP).

## Strategic Investment & Impact

Guided by the strategic plan, CHIP, and input from the CAC, the DST develops priority areas and identifies strategies to build an equity-centered Request for Proposal (RFP) process for innovative pilot projects. Continued key focus areas include health equity, language access, oral health integration, social determinants of health, behavioral health, traditional health workers, housing, peer support, and subpopulations of IHN-CCO members that experience health disparities.

- \$24 million directly invested in innovative pilots
- 91% of pilots that were expected to be sustained have been operationalized through IHN-CCO or by the champion organization
- Building integrated communication pathways between community agencies, the traditional healthcare system, community health, and Patient- Centered Primary Care Homes
- Report gaps and barriers, use data to align regional initiatives, and advance system change
